In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory. I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love towards all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

GOSPEL Luke 6:20-31

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Jesus looked up at his disciples and said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets. Hug a Hoodie – or Even a Reader!



Licensed Lay Ministers (LLMs) across the Church of England can now be both warm and instantly recognisable, thanks to the launch of an official national hoodie by the Central Readers' Council.

The idea, first sparked in the Diocese of Bristol, aims to help people identify lay ministers when they are out and about

in more informal settings, away from their robes. The hoodie also offers an opportunity for gentle evangelism, a way to start conversations about faith beyond the church doors.

One Bristol LLM, Karen, shared how her new hoodie opened an unexpected conversation with her neighbour, who remarked that there was "nothing up there". She replied with a smile, "You are right, God is not up there, he is down here with us every day." That moment, she said, would never have happened without the hoodie.

Another, Steve, said seeing someone wearing one was what first inspired him to explore lay ministry himself, proof that visibility really does matter.

The national hoodie, available in a cheerful "royal blue" to match the Readers' scarves, features the LLM and Church of England symbols boldly printed on the back and a smaller emblem on the chest.

Here in our benefice, we are proud of our Reader, Pat Smith, who gives so much to our worship and community life. When she receives her own hoodie and you spot her wearing it, you will know instantly who she is, and while you could certainly "hug a hoodie" in appreciation, perhaps do ask first!

The phrase "hug a hoodie" originated in 2006 after a speech by David Cameron encouraging compassion and understanding towards young people often labelled as troublemakers. How fitting, then, that these new hoodies also stand for warmth, visibility and connection within our church community.

Left Behind: Traveller Children Failed by the System



Schoolchildren from the Romany, Roma, and Irish Traveller communities are being left behind with lasting consequences, according to a new report from the charity the Traveller Movement.

The report, Fought not Taught: Tackling Institutionally Coercive Exclusions for Romani (Gypsy), Roma and Irish Traveller Children, highlights the disproportionate use of "off-rolling" — removing a pupil from the school roll without a formal exclusion — as well as pressure to home-educate, informal removals, and disciplinary systems that disadvantage these children.

The Bishop of Lincoln, the Rt Revd Stephen Conway, who wrote the foreword, described the issue as "a matter of justice for those who are excluded and left without a voice".

Among its 15 recommendations is a call for Ofsted to review behaviour policies nationally and shift focus towards early intervention and proportionate discipline. The report argues that inspections place too much weight on attainment and attendance while overlooking inclusion. It suggests that exclusion and elective home-education figures should form part of inspection criteria.

In 2023-24, "persistent disruptive behaviour" led to 176,000 school suspensions. The report states that children facing overlapping disadvantages, such as poverty, SEND needs, minority status, or trauma, are more likely to be excluded. It urges a move from punishment to understanding and support.

It calls for meaningful alternative education options and accessible online resources for children who travel. Early-years engagement is a key priority, including reinstating Sure Start centres to provide joined-up family and childcare support.

The report also recommends a statutory system for recording racist bullying, citing distressing examples from young respondents.

Bishop Conway said: "We must act now to ensure that no child is denied opportunity because of a lack of bold and creative thinking."

Report Warns Young People Struggling with Life's Pressures Children's Society surveys 10 to 17 year olds



One in ten young people are unhappy with their lives, according to the Children's Society's Good Childhood Report 2025, released on Thursday. The study, which consulted ten young advisers and more than 150 children aged ten to seventeen, highlights growing concerns about pressure, anxiety, and falling happiness levels.

Peer pressure, academic expectations, social media, and fears about the world were all cited as major sources of stress, with school identified as a key cause of anxiety. The charity is calling for a whole-school and whole-system approach to well-being, alongside continued expansion of mental health teams.

Children's happiness with schoolwork has now dropped below all other areas of life, with 11 per cent saying it makes them least happy. One in seven were unhappy with their appearance, describing unrealistic beauty standards and constant comparison.

Professionals consulted for the report pointed to rising poverty, poor housing, and a lack of holistic family support as key factors in the decline in well-being. The loss of youth clubs and safe community spaces was also raised.

Many young people described school as stressful, saying that academic success is often valued more than personal growth or creativity. They also said that if they are encouraged to spend less time on their phones, positive alternatives should be provided.

The charity welcomed new mental health initiatives but warned that small-scale efforts cannot keep up with growing needs. "We can and must do more," said chief executive Mark Russell. "With the right support, teenagers can feel heard, valued, and hopeful about their future."

Church Attendances Rise for Fourth Year



After more than two decades of steady decline, a significant shift is underway within the UK's religious landscape. For the fourth consecutive year, church attendance has risen, signalling a potential reversal of a long-established trend and offering a fresh sense of optimism among faith communities.

This sustained growth, documented in the latest statistics, is largely attributed to the impressive expansion of evangelical and Pentecostal congregations, as well as vibrant, multicultural churches, particularly in urban areas. These communities have often thrived by fostering a strong sense of belonging and through dynamic, contemporary forms of worship that resonate with younger generations and new families.

Furthermore, analysts suggest that a post-pandemic "re-evaluation of priorities" has played a crucial role. Following the isolation of lockdowns, many individuals have actively sought out community, spiritual grounding, and a place of collective support. The local church, for many, has provided that vital anchor.

While the established Anglican and Catholic churches continue to face challenges, many have also reported stabilising numbers, thanks in part to innovative local outreach programmes and a renewed focus on community service that extends beyond their congregations.

This four-year upward trend does not erase the significant declines of previous decades, and the broader picture remains complex. However, it undeniably marks a pivotal moment. It suggests that in an increasingly secular age, the deep-seated human need for community, purpose, and spiritual connection is finding a renewed home within the nation's churches.

Chaplain Rachel Fielding Delighted as Therapy Dog Alfie Wins Top BBC Award



A Lancashire hospital Deacon and Chaplain is offering spiritual care with a very special companion — Alfie, a specially trained and newly award-winning therapy dog.

Their partnership is a reminder of chaplaincy's holistic care, meeting people in moments of vulnerability with kindness, presence, and a wagging tail. Together, Rachel Fielding and Alfie bring comfort and joy to patients, with Alfie's gentle presence helping to open doors to pastoral support and brighten even the most difficult days.

Rachel serves at East Lancashire Hospitals NHS Trust (ELHT) with Alfie, who is the only therapy dog in England directly owned by an NHS trust. He provides wellbeing support for patients and staff across hospitals in Blackburn, Clitheroe, Accrington, Pendle, and Burnley, as well as community sites. Alfie is now a familiar and much-loved part of the chaplaincy team's work and even met the Prince and Princess of Wales during their 2022 visit to the Trust.

This month, his good work was recognised nationally when he was named overall winner of the BBC Countryfile Magazine Dog of the Year award.

Alfie lives with Deacon Rachel and is based in the hospital's Spiritual Care Centre. As well as being a Church of England chaplain, Rachel is also a qualified Therapy Dog Practitioner. Alfie followed in the pawprints of Jasper, another therapy dog owned by the Revd David Anderson, whose success inspired the Trust to fund Alfie through NHS Charities Together — a first for the NHS.

Rachel says that Alfie often helps patients open up about worries or faith, creating new opportunities for connection, hope, and healing. She now also trains other dogs for care-home ministry, extending the gift of comfort and companionship even further.

Further south, Playa Blanca has a more relaxed, upmarket feel. The waterfront promenade connects the marina with a series of small beaches, lined with

boutique shops and elegant dining spots. The nearby Papagayo coves, a string of pristine, golden-sand bays, are among the island's most scenic.

On the east coast, Costa Teguise is known for its breezy charm and gentle pace. It's a favourite among those who enjoy a touch of activity, particularly windsurfing and sailing, but without the crowds. As evening falls, the town square becomes a lovely place to sit back with a glass of local wine and enjoy the warm, unhurried atmosphere.

Lanzarote's landscapes are nothing short of spectacular. The Timanfaya National Park, a surreal volcanic terrain of craters and ash fields where the earth still radiates heat, is a must-see. Guided tours reveal the island's fiery origins, while those who prefer to explore independently can follow the walking trails that wind through the park's dramatic volcanic scenery, a truly unforgettable way to experience its otherworldly beauty.



The Cueva de los Verdes, a network of lava caves illuminated with soft lighting, offers a fascinating underground experience and a touch of mystery. Meanwhile, the César Manrique Foundation provides a window into the creative spirit that shaped the island. Built within volcanic rock, the late artist's home blends art, architecture and nature in a way that perfectly captures Lanzarote's essence.

For a taste of tradition, visit the historic town of Teguise. Once the island's capital, its cobbled streets and weekly market are ideal for a leisurely wander, with plenty of opportunities to pick up local crafts or enjoy a coffee in the sunshine.

Whether you're seeking gentle adventure or simple relaxation, Lanzarote delivers. Its smooth, scenic roads are perfect for cycling or leisurely drives, while its well-marked walking trails, particularly around the Famara cliffs or Timanfaya area, provide breathtaking views and a peaceful way to connect with nature.

For something special, take a short boat trip to La Graciosa, a small, car-free island just off Lanzarote's northern tip. Its pristine beaches and unspoilt charm make it a haven of tranquillity.

And, no visit is complete without sampling the island's remarkable wines. In the La Geria region, vines grow in craters of volcanic ash, creating distinctive, award-winning varieties. A leisurely wine tour, followed by a glass of crisp Malvasía as the sun sets over the volcanic hills, is the perfect way to round off a day on this beautiful and truly unique island.

Saint of the Week 31 October

Saint Alonso Rodriguez




Saint Alonso Rodriguez is a figure whose life speaks not of grand, world changing deeds, but of profound humility and unwavering faith. Born in Spain in 1533, his story is one of enduring immense personal tragedy with quiet resilience. He married and had children, but within a relatively short period, he experienced the devastating loss of his wife, his daughter, and his mother. This series of sorrows could have broken any man, yet Alonso found a new direction for his life.

After years of supporting his remaining son, he sought entry into the Society of Jesus. He was initially refused, his age and lack of formal education seen as impediments. However, his persistence paid off, and he was finally admitted as a lay brother, not a priest. At the age of forty, he was sent to the College of Montesion in Palma de Mallorca, where he was given the seemingly mundane role of porter, or doorkeeper.

For the next forty six years, Brother Alonso performed this duty with extraordinary dedication. He saw each knock on the door as the voice of God, and every visitor as Christ himself. His cell became a place of spiritual wisdom, where he offered counsel to students and professors alike, including a young Saint Peter Claver, whom he inspired to undertake his missionary work in the New World. Alonso's profound interior life, marked by intense prayer and asceticism, was the hidden source of his strength and influence.

Canonised in 1888, Saint Alonso Rodriguez stands as a powerful testament to the idea that sainthood is often found in the faithful fulfilment of ordinary duties. He reminds us that holiness is not about the prominence of one's position, but the love and devotion with which one serves, no matter how small the task may seem.

None of This is True Lisa Jewell

In "None of This Is True," Lisa Jewell crafts a chilling psychological thriller about the unsettling friendship between two women who share the same birthday. Alix Summer is a popular podcaster on the cusp of renewed success. Josie Fair is a quietly peculiar woman who feels her life has been unremarkable. By chance, they meet in a restaurant while both are celebrating their forty fifth birthdays.

Josie soon presents herself to Alix as a potential subject for her podcast, suggesting that her own life is on the verge of dramatic change. Intrigued, Alix agrees to interview her. What begins as a professional project quickly descends into an intense and invasive relationship. Josie begins to infiltrate Alix's life, offering unsettling advice and revealing dark secrets about her own marriage to a much older man.

As Alix delves deeper into Josie's story, she uncovers a disturbing history of manipulation and tragedy. She realises too late that she has become entangled in a web of dangerous lies. The narrative is punctuated by snippets from a Netflix true crime documentary, revealing from the outset that Josie is a suspect in a shocking series of events.



The idea for Everyday Faith is twofold. The app forms part of one of the Church of England's objectives of missional discipleship: "To become a church of missionary disciples where all God's people are free to live the Christian life, wherever we spend our time Sunday to Saturday." But the app also responds to overwhelming demand from our users for an app that delivers inspirational reflections year-round rather than being focussed on seasonal content during Lent and Advent. We wanted to create a space encouraging Christians to grow in their faith daily.

Everyday Faith is about where and how we encounter God as we go about our lives. Where is God in our daily lives? How do we find God in the fullness of everyday life? Whether you wish to develop your faith or support others in theirs, Everyday Faith is designed to support you in your life discipleship or vocational journey.

The app will provide you with carefully curated daily reflections, including selected Bible readings, a simple prayer to prepare you for the day ahead, and thoughts based on that week's theme.

The Everyday Faith app is optimised for Apple devices running iOS 15.0 and above, and Android 14 and above.

How to Support Us

Parish Giving Scheme

This scheme reduces the administrative burden on churches and volunteers by managing the entire donation process, including setting up direct debits, processing payments, and handling Gift Aid claims. Donors also benefit from the ease of adjusting their giving amounts and schedules to suit their financial circumstances, creating a more consistent and reliable income stream for the churches.

Launched in 2011, the PGS has grown steadily, supported by the Church of England and other Christian denominations, and is praised for its effectiveness in sustaining church activities and community outreach programs. By adopting the Parish Giving Scheme, churches can focus more on their mission and ministry, assured of a stable financial foundation.
